This year's conference will take place at ICN Business School, which practices a transdisciplinary approach that integrates art, technology and management. Keynote Speaker: Pierre Guillet de Monthoux

PIERRE GUILLET DE MONTHOUX is the scientific director of the Stockholm School of Economics (SSE) Art Initiative for education and research in management and business. "Curating Capitalism" is his most recent publication in an overall research program on the "Philosophy of the Firm" (conducted as a professor of management and philosophy at Stockholm University, Copenhagen Business School and currently at the centre for Art Business and Culture at SSE). His previous book titles include: Action and existence, anarchism for business administration (1983), Vulgärkantianische Unternehmenslehre, eine Einführung in der Kunst Industrie und Technologie zu konstruiren (1981), The moral philosophy of management from Quesnay to Keynes (1991), Esthétique du management : gestion du beau et du sublime de Kant à Gadamer (1998), The Art Firm: Aesthetic Management and Metaphysical Marketing (2004) and Curating Capitalism (2022).

'The Artist Coach'

We all know about the deep emotional and cognitive impressions a piece of arts can leave in an audience. A theatre piece, a concert, a sculpture - art confronts, questions, turns things upside down and inside out. It can sooth, nurture and heal as well, sometimes it can have a long-lasting impact over decades. Learning from the 'tiniest concert format of the world', the 'one-on-one-concerts' developed by Franziska Ritter (D), in which one artist performs a piece of music in front of one person-as-audience, we turn *Total Arts* into a coaching intervention. 'Total' here stands for Arts *as* intervention. One artist, one coachee, one piece of performance of 5-10 minutes max. The artists come either prepared or works with what s/he finds in the moment of the encounter. The coachee sets an intention and is free to share the intention or keeps it inside. The performance unfolds by the power of the unfolding connection. No mediated interpersonal reflection during or after this time, as we believe that Arts doesn't need that. The coachee is solely invited to write a 'love letter' to the artists containing whatever the coachee wants to share. We will introduce the format at the beginning of the conference on Wednesday, Aug 21st. There we showcase the format, and we invite present artists as well as volunteering guides to support and broaden the format. The day after, on different locations, these artistic coaching sessions will take place.





Invitation to a Water Ceremony Claire Barraclough

- Most of us don't have to look too far to find the traces of ceremonies and rituals scattered across our lives; from celebrating birthdays to routine morning coffees, there isn't much of our lives that hasn't been touched by the often-invisible threads of ceremonies. But what is it to re-awaken and bring the art of ceremonies back to the centre of our endeavours? Ceremonial rituals can be accurately and usefully described as 'collections of arts behaviours and objects' during which we can experience transcendent experiences (Brown & Dissanayake, 2018).
- But more than this, creating ceremony brings us into direct contact with the essential, non-negotiable, structural elements of life; elements, like those that make up Water. Ceremony uses symbols, objects, artifacts, activities that embody meanings, which reverberate, and communicate beyond and beneath language systems. With this in mind, please join us to create a ritualised ceremonial space together, to work with the essential and original element of Water; to co-create an artistic expression of the Origin of Total Art in the form of an 'Altar'.
- I invite all participants to bring 1 small bottle of water from where they live. We will meet every morning for 60mins to create an active Altar space. Together we will share stories from the Water we have brought, and then take the Water to accompany us to each workshop we attend, so it can be vibrationally informed by that experience.
- Every morning, we will continue to add to the altar of the community, by sharing and the attuned placements of the bottles of Water, objects, sounds, movements. To close the ceremony, each participant will receive a small bottle of water from the collectively created altar to return home with; Water that has been imbued with the vibrational resonances of each workshop, from each person, from each heart that it has visited and the journey of the group through this process.

I tried to make sense of the experience by writing about it. I needed more, there was more about the experience that I needed to get out. I tried to write a play. I failed. Finally, a conversation at AoMO in Liverpool broke things open for me and I wrote this monologue. I need to perform it. I only hope you will enjoy seeing it.

The Debrief



You are invited to the Debrief.

He spent weeks in intensive care before recovering in a neurological ward. When he left he realised that Artificial Intelligence had been a key part of diagnosing what was wrong with him. A.I had saved his life. Before he collapsed in that bakery and had seizure after seizure after seizure, he had developed the firm belief that A.I was on a trajectory to destroy Humanity. Now he had to reconcile those two views. Now he needed to debrief.

The Creative Journey

The Debrief is an experimental theatre piece that began its life at AOMO 2022 in Liverpool U.K.

In an age in which younger generations are crowd-sourcing their psychological and emotional wellbeing and healing, and debriefing their own trauma and struggles in Metaverses and in plain sight on social media, theatre maker, writer and academic Paul Levy, took his own personal debrief to the crowd, in a scratch version of this production.

After show conversation and a lot of debriefing of the debrief closed the chapter. Then an invitation to further develop the Debrief and to perform it at the Invasion Festival at Central Standard Theatre in Kansas, early in 2024.

Now Paul is bringing the Debrief home to AOMO, this time in Nancy in France, for further development.

Rational Madness Theatre invites you to The Debrief, a theatrical experiment in A. I-assisted psychological, emotional and spiritual processing. Drawing on the totality of arts possibility, the production contains solo story, movement and dance, visual arts, video, metaversal art, virtual puppetry, and the English tea making ceremony.
